NEWS FROM THE PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP (PPG)

Life, somehow, goes on....despite all the strikes, the war in Ukraine, the earthquakes in Turkey and Syria....and even more strikes.

Here at OCH, our thoughts are a tad more parochial. Our dedicated, wonderful staff continue to offer all our patients the care they need. But we, too, can and must also 'think outside the box'.....

The surgery, as previously advised, is a member of the Primary Care Network for Central Sutton, along with the Robin Hood Lane, Grove Road and Mulgrave Road surgeries.

Central Sutton has, sadly, some of the most deprived areas in the Borough....and as such, that can - and does - give rise to medical issues as a result of these social causes behind the deprivation.

It is early days, but there is an initiative taking shape that will help to address and combat these problems, through a multi-faceted approach by the surgeries, the local authority, Sutton Housing Partnership, community nursing, other local housing associations, community groups, our hospital Trust - and everyone else who can help alleviate these problems.

The abiding, overall concept is that these committed, interested parties will put in place measures to help counter the medical and mental health problems created by such deprivation - including those who are homeless or living in temporary accommodation.

There will be a roll-out of health-checks, and clinics, and through the feed-back that will be gathered, an 'outreach' programme put in place, to contact people by 'phone calls, and home visits. By adopting this pro-active, anticipatory care approach, it should reduce dramatically those cases where further intervention would have been necessary.

The NHS App

The NHS App is safe and secure. If you're aged 16 and over, you can register for the NHS App without visiting the practice. It is a simple and secure way to access a range of services on your smartphone or tablet and is free from app stores.

The NHS App is also available on the OCH website.

It can be used to conveniently:

- Book and cancel appointments
- Order repeat medication
- View your health record including consultations, diagnosis, documents and results of tests or investigations
- view your Covid vaccination status
- check your symptoms using reliable NHS information on hundreds of conditions and treatments
- register to be an organ donor
- choose how the NHS uses your data
- The NHS App should not be confused with the NHS COVID-19 App.

To download the NHS App on a mobile device:-

- 1. Open the App Store or Play Store.
- 2. Search for 'NHS App' and select install.
- 3. After installing, select the app to open it.
